I find the best way to tackle this problem is head-on. When you sit down to play, tell your table-mates that > you really enjoy the thematic elements, and you'd like to read the "fluff" aloud when it comes up. Then you can toss in a casual "Let me know if it slows things down too much."

As for reading theme aloud during solo plays -- go whole hog! My solo games of Arkham Horror LCG would be far less interesting if I weren't talking to myself and doing voices the whole time. Too many adults feel self-conscious about imaginative play. You have a big brain -- let it run wild and enjoy that thematic writing!






Under the Influence






SET, and T'zolkin are all excellent options for balancing a

diet of male-designed games.










Library Spotlight

Star Wars Legion is a minatures game set in the *Star* Wars universe. You set up the board with the miniatures from either the Rebel Alliance or the Empire.



This game is a fun ride for anyone who loved the cinematic experience that has

been created by George Lucas in the films.

If you went to see Star Wars: A New Hope and fell in love with Hans, Luke, or Leia OR if you just absolutely loved the relationship between Ray and Kylo Ren, this game is for you. For me, I always loved Anakin and his plotline and story. There is something unique about the evolution of Anakin. I think that Legion provides an opportunity for every single fan of the books, movies, comics, and other Star Wars stories.
