


Under the Influence

Library Spotlight

With over 400 titles in [toggle's] library, there are lots of amazing games to try. Here's one to check out!

Flintstones! Meet the Flintstones! They're a modern stone age family!

Design: Bernd Brunnhofer; Art: Michael Menzel, 2008 Recommendation by Alan Greenberg

When you need something that's easy for new gamers to learn and complex enough to keep experienced gamers interested, dig out a copy of *Stone Age*. How can you NOT love a game where, in order to gain another worker, you send 2 of your workers to a hut, where they stay for a while, before returning at the end of the round with a third worker?



Stone Age is a traditional worker placement game with a dice-rolling twist which allows for strategy development, but one that you develop as you go. In Stone Age, you use your workers to develop resources, which you use to buy Civilization Cards, which in turn provide immediate benefits and end-game scoring options, or Building Times which provide in-game points. At the end of the game, add up the in-game points and the options from your Civilization Cards and you have a winner.

The dice determine how many resources you collect – but only AFTER you have placed your workers. Not enough resources to use the other workers? Too bad, so sad! Oh, and don't forget to collect enough food to feed your workers, or they will suffer the consequences.

The game plays well with 2-4 players, and the choices you make with your workers WILL lead to your ultimate success (or failure). The dice-rolling mechanism, though, acts as an equalizer to narrow the gap between newbies and experiences players. The game is strategically tight, thematically consistent, easy-to-learn/hard-to-master, beautifully illustrated, and designed with an easy to understand icon system.

Even 12 years after publication, it's a modern classic, still in the BGG top 100. Whether you're playing with light gamers or heavy strategy enthusiasts, *Stone Age* has something for everyone.
